Director of the Centre for Real-World Learning and Professor of Learning at the University of Winchester. Bill founded CRL with Guy Claxton in 2008. In addition to his work with CRL, Bill is a trustee of The English Project, and with Philip Pullman, a patron of the Pegasus Theatre in Oxford.

Bill was recently appointed by the OECD as co-chair of the strategic advisory group overseeing the development of the new PISA 2021 test of Creative Thinking.

Bill is known internationally as a speaker on the subjects of learning, change, creativity, and leadership. He travels extensively to present key notes, most recently in Sydney, Philadelphia, Helsinki, Qatar, Melbourne, Auckland, Stockholm, Paris, Belfast, and Dubai.

He is a prolific writer, and has authored and co-authored over forty books including recently:

Teaching Creative Thinking: Developing learners who generate ideas and can think critically (with Ellen Spencer)
